Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI)

Project: Multiple Lease Lots Environmental Assessment

Locations: Simon-Jokela-Kultala Roads (T50N, R17W, S20&21) and Brookston Road (T50N, R18W, S36) in St. Louis County; Dagwaagin Road (T48N, R17W, S4); Brevator Road (T49N, R17W, S21); 112 Wheaton Road (T49N, R17W, S28); and 2608 Big Lake Road (T49N, R18W, S24) in Carlton County. ALL on the Fond du Lac Reservation.


Based upon the attached Environmental Assessment (EA) for the Multiple Lease Lots Project involving the construction of multiple individual single-family homes, garages, driveways, drinking-water wells, and septic systems on separate lease lots on the Fond du Lac Reservation, I have determined that by implementation of the Fond du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa proposed action and environmental mitigation measures as specified in the EA, the proposed Multiple Lease Lot Project will have no significant impact on the quality of the human environment. In accordance with Section 705(a) of the Fond du Lac Tribal Environmental Policy Ordinance (TEPO) (Ordinance #05/10, adopted by Resolution #1343/10 of the Fond du Lac Reservation Business Committee on September 21, 2010), an Environmental Impact Statement will not be required for this proposed project.

This determination is supported by the following findings:

1. Agency and FdL staff consultation and coordination was conducted and environmental issues related to development of the Multiple Lease Lots Project were identified. Alternative courses of action and mitigation measures were developed in response to environmental concerns and issues.
2. Section 4 of the Environmental Assessment discloses the environmental consequences of the proposed action and two potentially viable alternatives were considered, including the “no action” alternative.
3. The proposed action is planned to not jeopardize any federally or state listed threatened or endangered species. A Key to the Northern Long-Eared Bat 4(d) Rule for Non-Federal Activities was prepared, which determined an “Incidental Take” finding for all five lease lots. No notification to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is necessary.

4. Invasive plant species present on the lease lots will be evaluated by the Fond du Lac Invasive Species Coordinator for possible control efforts to prevent the spread of these species to other parts of the Reservation.

5. Section 4 and Appendix describe that there are no adverse effects on cultural properties, but recommends a Tribal Monitor be present during ground disturbing activities at three sites.
