The Fond du Lac Prevention / Intervention Department will be holding recreational activities beginning June 18, 2018. Native American Youth ages 6-17 years are eligible to participate if they are enrolled or if a parent or grandparent is an enrolled member of a federally recognized tribe and reside within the Fond du Lac Services Area. Program will provide recreational art/crafts, personal wellness and chemical health sessions. Lunch for youth will be provided by the Ojibwe School Summer Lunch Program. Field Trips will be held on Thursdays. A parent of chaperone will be required to attend with their child(ren). Information about the trips and permission slips will be sent home with youth one week prior to the field trip. (Prevention Intervention staff will be sending home weekly agendas, which will include activities planned, field trips, special trips, etc)

**NEW PREVENTION BEHAVIOR POLICY**

**The rules of the Prevention-Intervention Summer Program are intended to create a physically and emotionally safe environment for all summer program participants. However, the program does reserve the right to suspend or expel youth who chronically misbehave.**

**Please keep in mind, all circumstances are different and we want to keep youth in the program as much as possible suspending kids or bringing them home is our last resort..**

**Repetitive Negative Behavior will constitute dismissal from camp for the remainder of the summer**

- **Fighting: (Depending on the circumstance) youth may be suspended a full program week.**
- **Bullying: Repetitive teasing, harassing, threatening etc. child will be brought home and suspended up to 2 program days.**
- **Disrespect: Disobedience, inappropriate language or gestures, etc. child will be brought home, depending on circumstance child may be suspended 2 program days.**
- **Vandalism, theft or leaving premises (without permission) will not be tolerated youth will be subject to dismissal depending on circumstance but could be suspended from camp for up to 4 program days.**

## Summer Camp Rules

**Please be sure to READ these rules have changed since last year's program**

- 1) Please put your child's name on any and all clothing that is brought which includes:
  - Back Packs
  - Other Types of Bags
  - Towels
  - Swimsuits
  - Jackets
  - Sweatshirts
  - Etc
- 2) Be respectful to staff and other summer camp participants
- 3) NO physical violence- this includes:
  - Spitting
  - Hitting
  - Biting
  - Kicking
  - Pinching
  - Any sort of Bullying
- 4) No inappropriate language will be tolerated; this includes swearing, bullying, name-calling and or inappropriate gestures or comments.
- 5) Youth cannot go for walk or play in the woods without direct supervision from staff.
- 6) Youth are not to endanger themselves by leaving recreation area/ program without a written or verbal parental consent. Only when parental contact has been made and permission received, will a youth be allowed to leave.
- 7) Summer Camp youth will keep track of their personal belongings. Please be aware that tablets, cell phones, iPad, etc. are not recommended. If youth brings such electronics prevention intervention staff is not responsible for any lost, stolen or broken items.
- 8) Youth will wear shoes/ sandals at all times.
- 9) Youth will help staff keep track of, and put away all toys and equipment.
- 10) Youth will not purposely destroy equipment.
- 11) No tobacco, drugs or alcohol use will be allowed. This includes nicotine. Appropriate contacts, referrals will be made. Appropriate consequences will be applied.
- 12) Transportation provided to and from the Summer Program is a privilege; all school bus rules will be followed. Youth who cannot or will not follow bus rules will be subject or expulsion from transportation privileges.

13) Follow all water safety rules: whether at lake or pool

- No running on docks/poolside
- No diving or pushing from docks/ poolside
- No dunking, rough play or wrestling in water
- Only water toys on the beach/ poolside
- Get out of lake/pool as soon as you are told
- Buddy system will be followed
- Swimming activity may be denied to youth who decide to disobey or not listen to staff
- If program staff knows your child is not a strong swimmer your child will be required to wear a United States Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device.
- Prevention Intervention does safety check/count every 10min in the pool/lake. We ask youth to follow rules as they apply to getting out and waiting to be counted before reentering the water.

14) Youth that do not follow Summer Camp Rules will be brought home for the day, and further appropriate consequences will be applied.

- *Please keep in mind that all rules apply and will be followed on field trips. If a parent or chaperone misbehaves on a field trip, they too, will be subject to suspension of bus privileges. Bag checks for field trips are required from any participants going.*
- *The rules of the Prevention-Intervention Summer Program are intended to create a physically and emotionally safe environment for all summer program participants. However, the program does reserve the right to suspend or expel youth who chronically misbehave.*
- *Please read and go over these rules with your child or children. Your signatures indicate that you and your child have read and understand the rules. Failure to follow these and any other rules may result in your child being suspended or in extreme circumstances expelled from the Summer Program.*
