Seasons and Limit Changes for 2011 – 2012

All Species

Season dates are slightly different from last year to reflect the new calendar year.

Migratory Birds

In the Ceded Territories the daily limit is 18 total ducks of which not more than 12 can be mallards or 9 of any other species. On the Reservation the daily limit is 12 total ducks of which not more than 8 can be mallards or 6 of any other species.

Sandhill Cranes may be hunted in the 1854 Ceded Territory. Cranes may not be hunted on the Reservation or in the 1837 Ceded Territory. A carcass tag must be obtained before cranes can be hunted. See the migratory bird section for more information.

Registration of Deer

Deer taken on the Reservation or in the Ceded Territories may be registered online or by phone or at the usual registration stations. See the registration pages for more information.

Only deer can be registered online or by phone at this time.

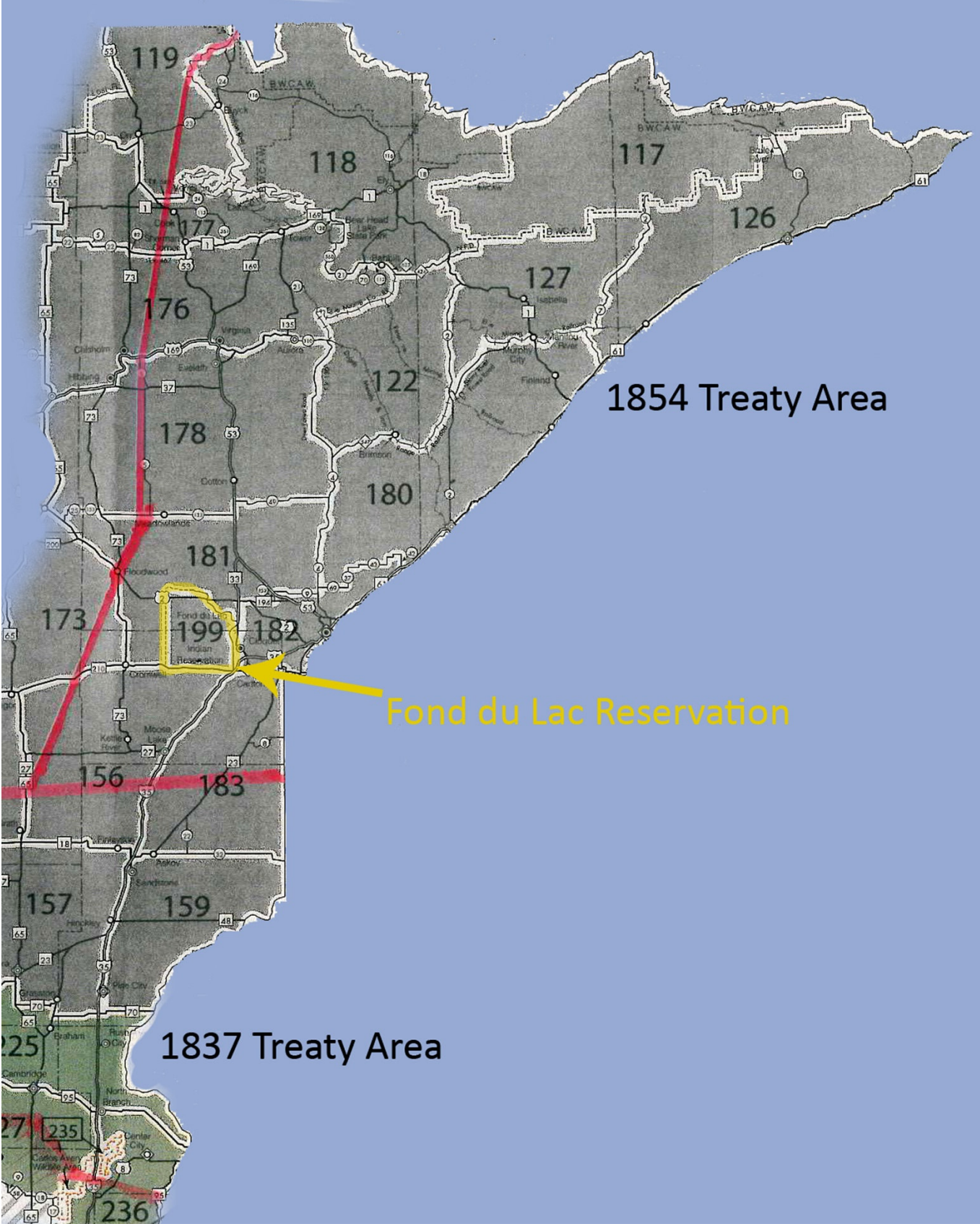
If you choose to register your deer online or by phone you will need the following information in order to complete the process.

1. The hunter's name.
2. The hunter's 4 digit license (ID) number.
3. The 4 digit number from the red or white carcass tag on the deer.
4. The unit where the deer was taken (see maps on the next page).
5. The date the deer was taken.
6. The deer's sex (buck or doe) and age (adult or fawn).

You will not receive a registration tag for a phone or online registration; however, your registration information will be recorded at the Resource Management Division office.

If you prefer, you may still register your deer in person at any of the usual registration stations listed on the preceding page.

Harvest unit numbers needed for deer registration. Unit 199 is the FDL Reservation.

DEER SEASONS AND LIMITS

1854 AND 1837 CEDED TERRITORIES

General

Each individual is allotted up to 3 Ceded Territory deer tags initially and one more with each deer registered. Additional Ceded tags may be obtained from the Resource Management Division office following registration of a deer. Either the tagged head or whole carcass must be present at registration. Ceded Territory tags are valid only in the 1854 or the 1837 Ceded Territory during open seasons. Ceded Territory tags may not be used for deer harvested on the Fond du Lac Reservation. Either sex is legal. The individual limit for deer tags is 15; however, the Division may provide up to 5 more tags per individual if conditions allow.

Special Deer Hunts

Information on State Park hunts and tribal permits in the 1837 Ceded Territory will be available at the Fond du Lac Resource Management Division office. The RBC has authorized the Resource Management Division to explore participation of Fond du Lac band members in special deer hunts in the 1854 Ceded Territory on a case by case basis. Contact the Resource Management Division for more information about the possibility of participation if you are interested in any of these hunts.

Archery and Firearms Seasons

Sept. 6 - Dec. 31.

Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

RESERVATION

General

Each individual is allotted up to 2 Reservation deer tags initially and one more with each deer registered. Additional Reservation tags may be obtained from the Resource Management Division office following registration of a deer. Either the tagged head or whole carcass must be present at registration. Reservation tags are valid only within the borders of the Fond du Lac Reservation during open seasons. Either sex is legal. The individual limit for Reservation deer is 6.

Regular Archery and Firearms Seasons

Sept. 6 - Dec. 31

Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

MOOSE SEASONS AND LIMITS

1854 CEDED TERRITORY

General

Hunters may not possess a moose permit for both the 1837 and 1854 Ceded Territories. Either sex moose, adults or calves may be harvested.

There will be 72 moose permits in the 1854 Ceded Territory distributed by a drawing system. Each permit is valid for only one Fond du Lac Moose Zone. A \$20 processing fee will be charged for each application and a \$50 refundable deposit is required for each permit. The \$50 will be refunded following the close of the season as long as a party has either registered a moose or returned an unused tag. Federal regulations regarding nonmotorized use must be followed in the BWCAW.

July 5 - First day to apply for 1854 moose permits.

August 12 - Last day to apply for 1854 moose permits.

August 15 - Drawing for 1854 moose permits.

Sept. 16 - Last day to pick up 1854 moose permits

Archery and Firearms Season

Sept. 24 - Dec. 31.

Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

1837 CEDED TERRITORY

General

Hunters may not possess a moose permit for both the 1837 and 1854 Ceded Territories. Either sex moose, adults or calves may be harvested.

5 permits available August 23 on a first-come-first-serve basis. Limit 1 per party of 3-4 hunters with a \$50 refundable deposit and valid licenses. The \$50 will be refunded following the close of the season as long as a party has either registered a moose or returned an unused tag. Hunters must accompany a Conservation Officer to the scene of harvest within 3 days of the harvest.

Archery and Firearms Season

Sept. 6 - Dec. 31.

Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

RESERVATION

There is no open moose season for the Fond du Lac Reservation.

BEAR SEASONS AND LIMITS

1854 CEDED TERRITORY

General

Hunters limited to one tag initially. A second tag may be obtained once the first bear is registered. Cubs or sows with cubs are not legal. Tags are valid in either the 1854 or 1837 Ceded Territories during open season, but not for bear harvested on the FDL Reservation.

Archery and Firearms Seasons

Sept. 1 – Nov. 27

Baiting

Aug. 12 – Nov. 27

Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

1837 CEDED TERRITORY

General

Hunters limited to one tag initially. A second tag may be obtained once the first bear is registered. Cubs or sows with cubs are not legal. Tags are valid in either the 1854 or 1837 Ceded Territories during open season, but not for bear harvested on the FDL Reservation.

Archery and Firearms Seasons

Sept. 1 - Nov. 15

Baiting

Aug. 12 – Nov. 15

Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

RESERVATION

General

Hunters limited to one tag initially. A second tag may be obtained once the first bear is registered. Cubs or sows with cubs are not legal. Reservation bear tags are valid only within the borders of the FDL Reservation during open seasons.

Archery and Firearms Seasons

Sept. 1 – Nov. 27

Baiting

Aug. 12 – Nov. 28

Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

There are no possession limits for migratory birds on the Reservation at this time. Sandhill cranes may not be hunted on the Reservation.

Shooting hours for migratory birds are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

Reservation Rice Lakes may be posted closed to hunting during the early part of migratory bird seasons.

FALL TURKEY SEASONS AND LIMITS

General

One tag available to hunters initially. Turkey hunting is allowed only in open portions of the 1837 and 1854 Ceded Territories and on the FDL Reservation. Hunters must register turkeys at the Fond du Lac Resource Management Division Office or with a Conservation Officer. Additional tags are possible upon registration of a bird. Hunting hours are one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

1854 CEDED TERRITORY

Fall Season Open and Closed Turkey Units

That portion of the 1854 Ceded Territory west of US Highway 53 and south of St. Louis County Highway 8 is open to turkey hunting.

Archery and Firearms Seasons

Fall Season: Sept. 6 - Dec. 31

Either sex of turkey may be taken in units open to fall hunting.

1837 CEDED TERRITORY

Fall Season Open and Closed Turkey Units

All turkey units in the 1837 Ceded Territory are open to fall hunting except units 152 (Mille Lacs Wildlife Management Area), 154 and 224 (Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge) are closed to all turkey hunting. Portions of units, 223, 227, 235, 236 and 249 are outside the 1837 Ceded Territory.

Archery and Firearms Seasons

Fall Season: Sept. 6 - Dec. 31

Either sex of turkey may be taken in units open to fall hunting.

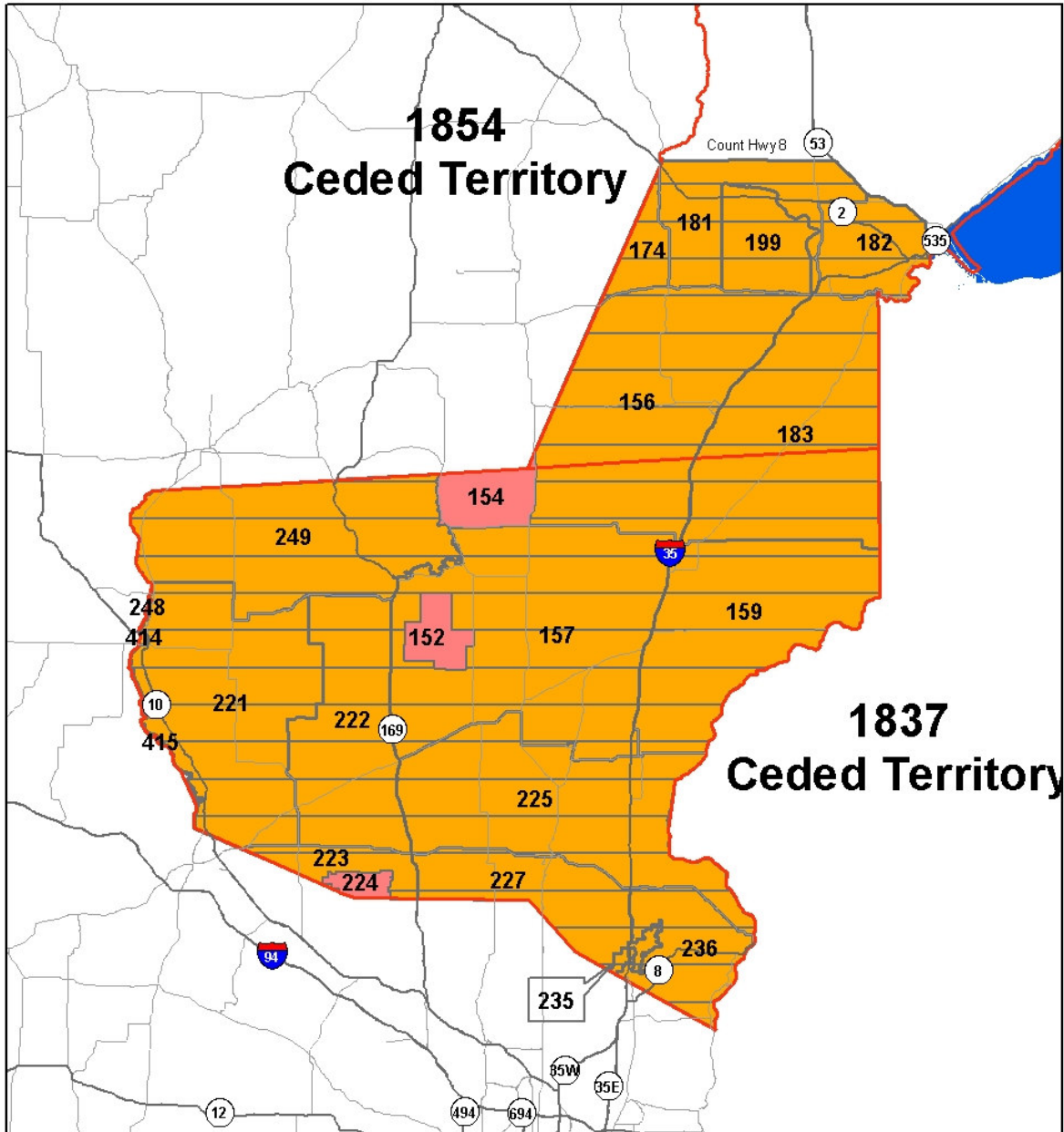

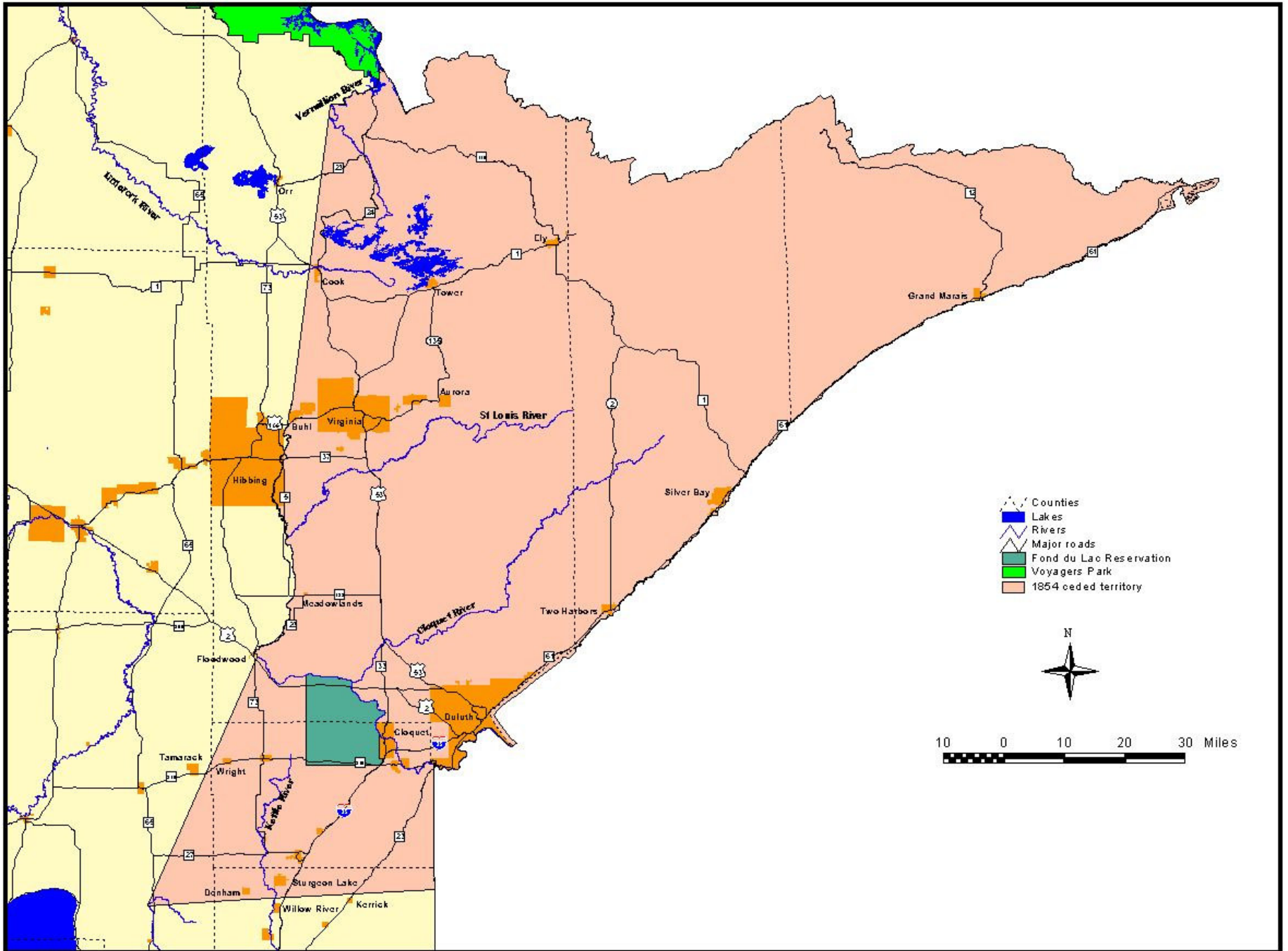
Fond du Lac Reservation
